On Saturday, April 19, McMahon Builders and the Maine Contractors & Builders Alliance will construct the Pathway 4 Paden at 389 Pleasant St., Lot 4. In the event of inclement weather the construction will take place at

a later date this spring.

Paden Robbins has VATER Syndrome and Vanishing White Matter disease and lives in a home where his family is unable to safely transport Paden in and out of their home. Paden's abilities to walk and to communicate are slowly deteriorating. Paden lives at home with his family and despite his multiple challenges he maintains a positive spirit and touches those around him with his infectious laugh. Through the generosity of McMahon Builders, the Maine Contractors & Builders Alliance, and local suppliers, the goal to help Paden and his family get a wheelchair ramp will soon come true.
