Accomplishments Summary

We are proud to report that Wheelchairs 4 Kids had a very successful 14th year. This fiscal year, we provided equipment or modifications to 325 children, a 15% increase over last fiscal year.

We continue to spend the majority of our funds on programs (83%), followed by fundraising (12%), and finally administration (5%). It is very important to us that our supporters are confident that their donations are being used wisely.

This fiscal year, Wheelchairs 4 Kids had **58** pieces of media coverage. This includes television, radio, print, and digital coverage.

Wheelchairs 4 Kids expanded our inclusion program, Wheely Fun Days, and held **18** events for our families with over **1,300** total participants. Our Wheely Fun Days included: Tampa Bay Buccaneers Training Camp, our Hallowheels Halloween Festival, the classic Wheely Wonderful Christmas Party, adaptive waterskiing in Winter Haven, ziplining at Gatorland, and many more!

This year, we returned to San Antonio where 23 Wheel Kid families joined us at Morgan's Camp for sleep-away summer camp. We also added an adaptive summer camp in Georgia for 28 Wheel

Kid families from across the Southeast. At our Camps, Wheel Kids participated in rock climbing, ziplining, ropes courses, and other iconic camp activities! Wheelchairs 4 Kids returned to Breckenridge, Colorado, with **20** of our Florida Wheel Kids for adaptive downhill skiing.

We hosted three successful internal fundraisers. Our fiscal year kicked off with a bang in July at Eddie V's Prime Seafood with our Jail & Bail, where we raised over \$200,000. In November we returned to Ruth Eckerd Hall with our Wheely Good Time Live and Silent Auction. May brought us to Innisbrook Golf Resort for our Celebrity Golf Tournament. This event featured a roster of professional athletes, including Rob Gronkowski.

Additionally, we were chosen by Talk of the Town Restaurant Group to be their benefiting charity for the months of January and February. This fundraiser included a round-up at each of their restaurants, as well as two private dinners with auctions at Charley's Steak House in Tampa.

The most important statistic, however, is family satisfaction. We are thrilled to report a **100%** family satisfaction rating.

Let's Roll Mobility Equipment Program

Our name may be Wheelchairs 4 Kids, but our impact has expanded since our founding in 2011.

Wheelchairs 4 Kids' Let's Roll Equipment Program addresses mobility and accessibility needs for children with physical disabilities.

Through our flagship program, we provide wheelchairs, home and vehicle modifications, as well as other necessary medical equipment to the children we serve at no charge to their families.

Many children living with physical disabilities are using wheelchairs and other equipment that no longer fits them, no longer matches their needs, or is in poor condition. Not only is it unsafe for a child to use this equipment, but continuing to use the equipment could have a negative impact on their overall health. Medical conditions caused by using unsuitable equipment include scoliosis,

respiratory problems, and pressure sores.

Additionally, families are often left caring for their disabled child in homes that are not modified to fit their needs and with vehicles that are unable to transport their necessary medical equipment. We have modified bathrooms to accommodate the child's needs by installing roll-in showers, built ramps so that children in mobility equipment can easily and independently access their homes, and installed lifts on vehicles so that families can transport their child's equipment safely.

Our Let's Roll Program also encompasses our Facility Program, which provides gently used equipment from our inventory to schools, clinics, and other facilities, in order to benefit multiple children in their care.

Wheelchairs 4 Kids is proud to have provided almost 2000 pieces of mobility equipment or modifications since inception.

Wheely Fun Day Inclusion Program

Once a family's equipment request has been completed through our Let's Roll program, they are invited to join us for **Wheely Fun Days.** This program focuses on inclusion and socialization.

Wheel Kids are invited to join us for amazing experiences where they build confidence and community.

All of our Wheely Fun Day activities are adapted to be accessible for mobility aid users, and are hosted at no cost to the families.

Our Wheel Kids go waterskiing, ziplining, and indoor skydiving. They attend Tampa Bay Buccaneers Training Camp, sled hockey clinics with the Lightning Community Hockey Development team, and live WWE events. They make memories that will last a lifetime

at adaptive summer camps, Christmas parties, and Halloween festivals. These experiences help them make connections with each other, as well as break the ice with their peers.


